

# World Holstein Friesian Federation Newsletter No. 2 Dec 2009

WHFF Council met for the second time during 2009 at the World Dairy Expo, Madison, USA, clearly demonstrating the commitment of Council to deliver the changes expressed by members at the last General Assembly. Council approved the Strategic Plan which is pivotal to managing the dynamics of change, concentrating on the delivery of services to Holstein organisations. In addition, closer collaboration with other international organisations through Working Group structures was agreed. The main topics discussed were:-

#### Genomic Selection

The rapid development of this technology will undoubtedly impact on the future activities of all Herdbook Associations. There are many aspects associated with genomics that require authenticated recording programs to be developed and implemented. Council has approved the formation of a Task Force under the chairmanship of J Meyer (USA) to concentrate on the activities and developments of this significant advancement in Holstein Breeding techniques. In addition the Task Force will also be responsible for collating information concerning the fertility of the Holstein breed.



## Type Harmonisation

The success of this working group continues as it has particular relevance to our organisation members' herds. The 2010 Classifier Workshop will concentrate on the assessment of feet, legs and locomotion, a really hot topic amongst Holstein breeders. This is an extremely important and in many ways, a unique workshop, ensuring the continued success of the WHFF Type Harmonisation program. Council encourages all member countries to attend as it provides an opportunity for like minded people to discuss and express their views and opinions.



#### Welcome to New Members

Council approved two new applications for membership: Croatia and Korea.

#### Korea:

The Korea Animal Improvement Association is part of the larger National Animal Improvement Association. It has registered over 1 million animals since 1960, and has an active membership of 3238. The Association is working on registration and performance testing of Holsteins

#### Croatian Holstein Breeders Federation:

This is a new organisation being established in Jan 2008. It has 300 members with just over 50,000 registered Holsteins. It is managed by an elected committee of 7 and an elected President. The Federation is responsible for many aspects of Holstein breeding and is currently researching the introduction of a Type Classification programme.
