2023 WHFF World Conference

I am very pleased to confirm that the next WHFF World Conference and General Assembly, will be held in Le Puy du Fou, France on the 21st to 22nd November 2023. More details will follow.

2022 WHFF World Classification Workshop

The 15th WHFF Type Harmonisation Workshop was held in Morges, Switzerland from 20th to 22nd



September 2022. Fifty one participants from 27 countries attended.

The WHFF Type Harmonisation Working Group met at the Workshop and made 9 recommendations to the Council. All recommendations were approved by the Council at the October meeting.

- 1. Faster implementation of new traits
- 2. The trait Angularity has been changed to 'Rib Structure'.
- 3. All reference to cms were removed from Stature definition.
- 4. The Working Group will review the pictures and descriptions on the trait list to see if they can be made clearer.
- 5. The phenotypic correlation of body traits, feet and legs traits and udder traits, based on the last 12 months of data, will be shared.
- 6. Focus traits: Chest Width, Rib Structure (previously Angularity), Rear Legs Rear View, Foot Angle, Locomotion, Fore Udder and Udder Support.
- 7. Body Depth should be scored independently from Stature. Countries should be made aware that they should score linear traits as a one-dimensional trait.
- 8. For next workshop the Working Group will produce a list of conformation defects based on how commonly they are scored and the incidence in population.
- 9. Continue the program of Head Classifiers Workshop.

A fuller report is being written and will be sent to you in due course.

2022 ICAR Conference

The ICAR Conference was held in Montreal, Canada June 2022. It was held as a joint face to face and virtual Conference. As a virtual participant I could only view one session stream. The topics I viewed were around body condition score, data selection tools and sustainability. All presentations are available to download on www.icar.org

Monogenetic Traits and Registration

The WHFF Monogenetic Traits and Registration Working Group have discussed the coding of haplotypes with an expert industry group and will be creating a document for distribution to the membership. The new trait BLIRD will also be discussed and reported back to the membership.
