Be the privileged guests of Louis XIV in this pavilion castle reserved for the court of the Sun King and relive the splendour of the Grand Siècle!








Le Camp du Drap d'Or *** - Standard

Each hotel has wifi, TV, etc. as well as a bar area.


You will have breakfast in each accommodation, a dining room is provided for this purpose. Lunch and dinner will be taken together in the Grand Siècle hotel.
