GDPR: General Data Protection Regulation

- Law is already in place but countries have until 25 May 2018 to start enforcing it.
- Purpose of the GDPR is to give citizens back control of their personal data and simplify the regulatory environment for businesses
- GDPR is principle based, not rule based → vague in nature
- Scope: Data of persons staying in the EU
- Punishments for non-compliance:
 - Fines of up to 4% of global annual turnover
 - Company can be forced to stop processing personal data.



GDPR: Roles

- Subject: the natural person of whom personal data is processed
- Controller: the owner and controller of the processing of the personal data
- Processor: a party processing personal information on demand of the controller
- Supervisory Authority: government body that supervises and enforces the GDPR in a specific country



GDPR: definition personal data

'personal data' means any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject');

an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person;





Sensitive Personal Data

Processing of personal data revealing

 racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs, or trade union membership,

For the purpose of uniquely identifying a natural person

biometric data

Data concerning

Health, sex life or sexual orientation

Genetic data

Data relating to

criminal convictions, offences, security measures

Special categories of data concerning children



CRV Interpretation of Personal Data

General Identifiers

- Name, address, Social Security Number
- Communication: telephone number, IMEI, IP Address, MAC Address, SSID, ...

Customer Specific Identifiers

- Customer Number
- Relation Number
- UBN (Farm number)
- Location Number

Employee Specific Identifiers

- User ID
- Employee Number

Animal information (to be defined)

CRV has sensitive personal data (e.g. HR- files)



Rights of Subject

- Right of information
- Right to see what personal data the controller has on the subject
- Right to rectification
- Right to erasure (Right to be forgotten)
- Right of a human decision
- Right of Data Portability
- Right to restriction of processing

Responsibilities Controller

- Only process personal data if there is a legal basis
- Protect personal data
 - Appoint a Data Privacy Officer (DPO) in a number of cases
 - If data is processed by a processor, have a Data Processor Agreement (DPA) in place
 - Do not store data outside the EU
 - Documentation duty (Record of processing activities)
 - Implement protection controls
- Consider privacy
 - Privacy by Design
 - Privacy by Default
 - Privacy Impact Analysis
- Support rights of the subject within 4 weeks
- Report data breaches to the Supervisory Authority
